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Quarterly Overview and Appendix 4C

Sydney, 29th January, 2010: Technology company, Mint Wireless Limited (ASX: MNW) today reported cash flow for the quarter ended 31 December, 2009. The total cash receipts from customers for the quarter were \$3.437 million.

Net operating and investing cash flow totaled a positive inflow of \$231,000.

The cash outflows for the period included an inventory prepayment of \$2.189 million. This represents confirmed customer orders for which the cash receipts will follow in the next quarter.

During the quarter, Mint Technology has started to deliver a range of digital set top boxes to its strategic partner Uniden. This was a start of an increase in product launches and sales activity in 2010.

At the end of the quarter, the company has successfully delivered its mobile payment solution to Towncars, a large corporate fleet of hire cars. They have begun transacting on the Mint Payment solution and will look to grow its transaction volumes as their fleet grows nationally.
